



EAIT International Scholarship – Master of Architecture International Scholarship Terms and Conditions

This scholarship is maintained by the Faculty of Engineering, Architecture and Information Technology (EAIT) at the University of Queensland

1 Purpose

The purpose of the scholarship is to encourage and reward international students studying the Master of Architecture coursework program.

2 Eligibility

This scholarship is for international students applying to study at UQ in the Master of Architecture on a full-time basis. International students currently receiving fee sponsorship are ineligible for this scholarship. The award of scholarship is based on academic merit and suitability to the program. The number of scholarships is at the discretion of the Executive Dean and the Head of School.

3 Benefits

The scholarship covers 25% of total tuition fees for the indicated degree program.

The scholarship does NOT provide for:

- a) Overseas Student Health Cover
- b) Living Allowances
- c) Books
- d) Tuition fees for repeating failed courses
- e) Student Amenities Fee

4 Obligations of Students

- a) Students are expected to fulfil all requirements associated with their student visa.
- b) Students shall diligently and to the best of their ability apply themselves to the successful completion of their degree.
- c) Students are required to conform to University regulations (including disciplinary provisions).
- d) Notification in writing to the Faculty is required if the student
 - wishes to defer, transfer, or withdraw from the approved program
 - wishes to apply for an extension
 - is absent for any reason (other than recreation leave) for a period of 14 days or more from the place of study, except with prior approval of the Associate Dean and Head of School.

5 Health Insurance

Students are required to pay for their medical insurance through the Allianz OSHC scheme. Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) is a compulsory requirement of your student visa.

6 Termination of Award

The scholarship will be terminated:

- a) If the student fails to maintain full-time study.
- b) If the student transfers to another program in UQ or withdraws from the University.
- c) Please note approval from the University is required if a student wishes to transfer or withdraw from the program. The University may require the student to repay the scholarship funds.
- d) If, after due inquiry, the Faculty of Engineering, Architecture and Information Technology concludes that the student has not fulfilled obligations, or is not making satisfactory academic progress.
- e) Satisfactory academic progress means the recipient must maintain a GPA of at least 5 for each semester enrolled in their program. A recipient failing to maintain satisfactory academic progress must show cause why the scholarship should not be cancelled.
