



EAIT International Scholarship –Advanced Standing, All Countries Scholarship Terms and Conditions

This scholarship is maintained by the Faculty of Engineering, Architecture, and Information Technology (EAIT) at the University of Queensland

1 Purpose

The purpose of the scholarship is to encourage and reward students studying UG coursework programs administered by the Faculty.

2 Eligibility

This scholarship is for international students applying to study at UQ on a full-time basis. International students currently receiving fee sponsorship are ineligible for this scholarship. Students need to have been granted credit towards the EAIT program they have applied for.

**Note: For students enrolled in dual programs, only 50% of the EAIT component of the program will be paid for. The scholarship will not count towards non-engineering courses.*

3 Selection process

- a) For the selection process for scholarships funded by the School applications will be assessed by the Head of School.
- b) Applications are assessed based on academic merit and suitability to the chosen program.
- c) Student's current GPA and academic transcript will be assessed. The scholarship committee will access the transcript from the UQ student records and students do not need to attach a transcript to their scholarship application.
- d) The Personal Statement should include the reason why the student is seeking a scholarship and wanting to study their chosen program. It is also recommended students include information regarding any relevant extra-curricular activities which may support their scholarship application.

4 Benefits

The scholarship covers half (50%) of total tuition fees for the indicated degree program.

The scholarship does NOT provide for:

- a) Overseas Student Health Cover
- b) Living Allowances
- c) Books
- d) Student Amenities Fee

5 Termination of Award

The scholarship will be terminated:

- a) If, after due inquiry, the Faculty of Engineering, Architecture and Information Technology concludes that the student has not fulfilled obligations, or is not making satisfactory academic progress.
- b) If the student transfers to another program in UQ or withdraws from the University.
- c) Please note approval from the University is required if a student wishes to transfer or withdraw from the program. The University may require the student to repay the scholarship funds.
- d) If the student fails to maintain full-time study.
- e) Satisfactory academic progress means the recipient must maintain a GPA of at least 5 for each semester enrolled in their program. A recipient failing to maintain satisfactory academic progress must show cause why the scholarship should not be cancelled.

6 Obligations of Students

- a) Students are expected to fulfil all requirements associated with their student visas.
- b) Students shall diligently and to the best of their ability apply themselves to the successful completion of their degree.
- c) Students are required to conform to University regulations (including disciplinary provisions).
- d) Notification in writing to the Faculty is required if the student
 - wishes to defer, transfer, or withdraw from the approved program
 - wishes to apply for an extension
 - Is absent for any reason (other than recreation leave) for a period of 14 days or more from the place of study, except with prior approval of the Head of School.

Health Insurance

Students are required to pay for their medical insurance through the Allianz OSHC scheme. Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) is a compulsory requirement of your student visa.
