



Au Family Scholarship

(Established in 2025 through an absolute gift from the Au Family.)

1. Purpose

The purpose of the Scholarship is to support students experiencing financial hardship.

2. Definitions

In these rules –

Approved Program means any program at The University of Queensland.

President means the President of the Academic Board.

Satisfactory Academic Progress means meeting the requirements to remain enrolled in accordance with the University's Academic Progression Procedure.

Scholarship means the Au Family Scholarship.

3. Award and Selection Committee

- (1) Up to two Scholarships will be awarded in a year in accordance with these rules.
- (2) The value of each Scholarship will be at least \$6,300 for each year that it is held, with the combined value of the Scholarships limited to the annual distribution from the fund.
- (3) The maximum duration of each Scholarship is one year.
- (4) The Scholarship will be awarded on recommendation from the President of the Academic Board (or nominee) after consultation with the Director, Student Enrichment and Success (or nominee).

4. Eligibility and Award Criteria

- (1) An applicant is eligible for the Scholarship, if the applicant –
 - (a) submits an application to the President, by the closing date for applications;
 - (b) is enrolled in Approved Program in the year of the award; and
 - (c) can demonstrate financial hardship by providing documentary evidence.
- (2) The Scholarships are awarded to the students who best demonstrate the eligibility and award criteria of evidence of financial hardship.
- (3) Preference will be given to applicants who have a usual place of residence in Hong Kong, China, Singapore, Bangladesh, Cambodia, India, Indonesia, Japan, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand or Vietnam.

5. Conditions

- (1) A recipient may hold the Scholarship for up to one year, subject to the recipient –
 - (a) continuing to be enrolled in an Approved Program; and
 - (b) maintaining Satisfactory Academic Progress.
- (2) If the recipient fails to satisfy rule 5(1), the recipient must show cause to the President why the Scholarship should not be terminated.

6. Deferral and Interruption

The Scholarship cannot be deferred or interrupted.

7. Termination

The University may terminate a Scholarship if –

- (a) the recipient does not show cause to the reasonable satisfaction of the University as provided for in rule 5(2); or
- (b) the recipient defers or interrupts their study; or
- (c) there is a finding of misconduct against the recipient.
